On the single roll of this microfilm publication is reproduced a series of about 650 selected photographs of Franklin D. Roosevelt, 32d President of the United States. These photographs, which date from 1913 when Roosevelt assumed the office of Assistant Secretary of the Navy until his death as President in April 1945, are from records transferred from various Government agencies to the National Archives.

The arrangement of the photographs on the film is chronological. If a caption provided either an obviously erroneous date, or a file date rather than an exposure date, or no date at all, an attempt was made to date the photograph through the use of standard reference sources and internal evidence. When the appropriate date could be determined, it was added to the caption and placed in brackets. Finding aids to the photographs are a name index and table of contents that are filmed after these introductory remarks.

The standard reference sources used in dating the photographs include the New York Times Index; the New York Times; the Public Papers and Addresses of Franklin D. Roosevelt, compiled and edited by Samuel I. Roserman; and Foreign Relations of the United States, compiled and edited by the U.S. Department of State. Authenticity is not claimed for either the original caption dates or dates supplied by NARS.

A few photographs are undated. These were placed in a special section titled "ca. 1913-45" and filmed at the end of the roll; within this section a rough chronological arrangement was attempted.

Each reproduced photograph is accompanied by a caption and a call number. All captions are the originals assigned before the photographs were transferred to the National Archives. The call numbers were arbitrarily assigned by the Audiovisual Branch of NARS for assistance in ordering copies. The call number is a combination of numbers and letters separated by hyphens; for example, 80-G-48941 and 208-PU-174A-1. All other explanatory marks, corrections, or additions that have been made by the staff of NARS have been enclosed in brackets.

All photographs with their captions originated within the various Government agencies, with the exception of those selected from the New York Times Paris file in Record Group 306. This file contains photographs originating with the New York Times Paris office and many other private sources. Only those photographs for which the Government has purchased full publication rights were selected from the file for filming.

Copies of all photographs reproduced in this publication are available from the Audiovisual Branch, National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C. 20408. The complete call number for each reproduced photograph must be included in the order. Photographs of Franklin D. Roosevelt in the National Archives that have copyright restrictions were not reproduced in the publication. These may be seen upon request in the Audiovisual Branch of NARS.

The reproduced photographs are from National Archives record groups as follows: Records of the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture, Record Group 16; Records of the Bureau of Ships, Record Group 19; Records of the National Park Service, Record Group 79; General Records of the Department of the Navy, Record Group 80; Records of the Office of the Chief Signal Officer, Record Group 111; Records of the United States Marine Corps, Record Group 127; Records of the Office of War Information, Record Group 208; and Records of the United States Information Agency, Record Group 306.

Other sources of Government photographs of Franklin D. Roosevelt include the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library, Hyde Park, N.Y., and the Army Photographic Center, Washington, D.C.

The records reproduced in this microfilm publication were prepared for filming by Charles Palm, under supervision of Josephine Cobb. Charles Palm also wrote this introduction and provided other editorial material.

NAME INDEX

This index includes names selected from captions accompanying the photographs. Caption dates may enable the reader to estimate the location of the images on the film. The asterisk after the years 1913-20 indicates that these photographs are in the special section "ca. 1913-45" filmed at the end of the roll.

1	1913-21: Assistant Secretary Roosevelt at a rifle range, on inspections, with chiefs of Navy Department bureaus, in portrait poses, with Secretary of the Navy Josephus Daniels, and on tours of Europe in 1918 and 1919.
2	1933-40: President Roosevelt taking part in the 1933 inaugural ceremony, signing bills, making awards, welcoming dignitaries, and administering oaths to officials.
3	1941: President Roosevelt at the 1941 inaugural ceremony, aboard the U.S.S. <u>Augusta</u> and H.M.S. <u>Prince of Wales</u> during the Atlantic Conference with Winston Churchill, and on tour of military bases in South Carolina.
4	1942: Includes photographs of President Roosevelt reporting to Congress, making presentations, and touring military bases and war industry plants.
5	1943: President Roosevelt on trips to and from the Casablanca and Teheran Conferences and on a tour of military bases and war industry plants in April.
6	1944: President Roosevelt on a tour of the West Coast, aboard ship on the Pacific Ocean with Admiral Nimitz and General MacArthur, and on a December tour of Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.
7	1945: President Roosevelt at his desk making presentations, with his family at the White House, at the 1945 inaugural ceremony, and on the trip to and from the Yalta Conference.
8	ca. 1913-45: Photographs that could not be dated precisely to allow interfiling in the chronological series. They show Franklin D. Roosevelt as Assistant Secretary of the Navy and as President.
