## SELECTED PHOTOGRAPHS OF DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER, 1943-1961

A series of about 500 selected photographs of Dwight D. Eisenhower, General of the Army and 34th President of the United States, is reproduced on the single roll of this microfilm publication. The photographs date from 1943, when Eisenhower was Allied Commander in Chief in the western Mediterranean, until his retirement from the Presidency in January 1961. The majority of the photographs concern his two Presidential terms, 1953-61. Other photographs cover his service as Supreme Commander, Allied Expeditionary Forces; Chief of Staff, United States Army; Supreme Commander, Allied Powers in Europe; and president of Columbia University.

The photographs for this publication were selected from a large number of Eisenhower photographs in the custody of the National Archives and Records Service (NARS) to illustrate major events in his career; to show the variety of his activities; to record the faces of as many as possible of the important officials of his administration as well as other national and foreign figures with whom he came in contact; and to indicate the wide range of such photographic records relating to him that are available in the National Archives.

All photographs originated within Government agencies, with the exception of those selected from the New York Times Paris file in Records of the United States Information Agency, Record Group 306. This file contains photographs originating with the Times Paris office and other private sources. Only those photographs for which the Government has purchased full rights of publication were selected for filming. Photographs that have copyright restrictions were not reproduced in this microfilm publication, but they may be seen upon request in the NARS Audiovisual Records Division. Other Eisenhower photographs in NARS that were not selected for this publication are also available for viewing in the Audiovisual Records Division.

The arrangement of the photographs on the film is chronological. If a caption provided either an obviously erroneous date, a file date rather than an exposure date, or no date, the photograph has been dated through the use of standard reference sources and internal evidence. When the appropriate date could be determined, it was added to the caption and placed in brackets. Authenticity is not claimed for either the original caption dates or the dates supplied by NARS. A few undated photographs were placed in a special section and filmed at the end of the roll; within this section a rough chronological arrangement is presented.

Each reproduced photograph is accompanied by a caption and

an identification number. Most captions were assigned before the photographs were transferred to the National Archives; if captions were lacking, they have been provided and appear within brackets. If the caption could not be filmed with the photograph it has been filmed in the following frame. Explanatory marks, corrections, or additions made through the use of standard reference sources and internal evidence by NARS have been enclosed in brackets. Some of the original captions were typed or retyped for legibility and appear without brackets. The identification numbers were arbitrarily assigned by the Audiovisual Records Division for assistance in ordering copies. The identification number is a combination of numbers and letters separated by hyphens; for example, 79-AR-1234-A and 306-NT-280-9.

The standard reference sources used in dating and captioning the photographs include Alfred D. Chandler, Jr., ed., The Papers of Dwight David Eisenhower: The War Years; Dwight D. Eisenhower, The White House Years; the New York Times Index; and Public Papers of the Presidents of the United States: Dwight D. Eisenhower.

All of the photographs are from the following National Archives record groups: Records of the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture, Record Group 16, Records of the Bureau of Public Roads, Record Group 30, Records of the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Record Group 38, Records of the National Park Service, Record Group 79, General Records of the Department of the Navy, Record Group 80, Records of the United States Marine Corps, Record Group 127, Records of the Office of War Information, Record Group 208, Records of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Record Group 255, and Records of the United States Information Agency, Record Group 306.

Copies of all photographs reproduced in this publication are available from the Audiovisual Records Division (NNV), National Archives (GSA), Washington, DC 20408. The complete identification number for each reproduced photograph must be included in the order.

Other sources of Government photographs of Dwight D. Eisenhower include the Dwight D. Eisenhower Library, Abilene, Kans., the United States Information Agency, and the Army Photographic Center, Washington, D.C.

1	1943-52: Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower in portrait poses; with Presidents Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry S. Truman, Winston Churchill, and other statesmen; on military duty in Europe and in the United States; at victory ceremonies; on trips; and as president of Columbia University.
2	1953: President Eisenhower at his inauguration; with Vice President Richard Nixon, congressional and Cabinet figures, Churchill, and others; and playing golf.
3	1954: President Eisenhower delivering his State of the Union message; signing bills; with Secretary of State John Foster Dulles, Gen. Douglas MacArthur, and others; and at a baseball game.
4	1955: President Eisenhower at press conferences; making radio and television broadcasts; with Cabinet members, J. Edgar Hoover, and other public and private figures; and at Gettysburg.
5	1956: President Eisenhower announcing that he would run for reelection, with family members and others, making campaign appearances, and accepting gifts.
6	1957: President Eisenhower at the 1957 inauguration; making addresses and other appearances; and with former President Herbert Hoover, German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer, Prime Minister Kishi of Japan, Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip of Great Britain, President Ngo Dinh Diem of Viet Nam, and other foreign leaders.
7	1958: President Eisenhower with the Civil Rights Commission, with political leaders, and with British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan and others.
8	1959: President Eisenhower with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev and other foreign leaders.
9	1960-61: President Eisenhower with French President Charles De Gaulle, on a Far Eastern tour, campaigning for Richard Nixon, and with President-elect John F. Kennedy.
10	Undated: Eisenhower during military service, as president of Columbia University, and as President of the United States.
